
2009 IN REVIEW

Frequently Asked Questions

Has there been an "insulin resistance" noted in patients receiving the REDOXS© supplements?

No, insulin resistance has NOT been noted. In fact there is evidence that glutamine enhances insulin sensitivity. Refer to Bakalar B et al, Crit Care Med 2006:381-6.
