

## **EDCS Additions**

(1) Microbiology taxonomy: Fungi/Yeast → Blastomyces → dermatitidis

(2) Nutrition Taxonomy: NESTLE → Resource Beneprotein Powder

(3) \*Daily Nutrition: There is now an option for sites to indicate if lipids were not given.

## **Scoring Child's Class C Liver Disease**

ensure you use prothrombin time (PT) to score the patient. Partial thromboplastin time (PTT) should not be used.

## **Outcomes**

### Hospital Outcome

For patients who are still in hospital 6 months following randomization (i.e. not discharged to a rehab or palliative floor and status not changed to 'alternate level of care') then the hospital discharge should be recorded as the date/time at 6 months post randomization. Please make a note in the comments field of the Hospital outcome form that the patient was still in the hospital at the 6-month follow-up. On the EDCS leave the discharge date/time field blank. **3 & 6-Month Follow-up should still be completed.**

### 3 & 6-Month Follow-up

For patients where circumstances prevent the study coordinator from contacting them directly to answer the SF-36 at 3 & 6 months (e.g. mental status change, incarceration), sites are asked to attempt to contact a family member or health care professional that may have access to the patient.
